# WHAT'S ON MY MIND


We leave for the national in 3 days, so needless to say that's a lot of what's occupying my brain. As usual it's full of plans and questions about dog shows!

#### CKCSC OF GREATER ATLANTA CHARITY AUCTION

Well I have to say that each year you all never fail to amaze me. This year was no different! Thanks to all that came early and helped set everything up—the move from my hotel room to the banquet room went smoother and faster than ever before. (Where were you when Lu hauled everything up from the basement for me—I'm sure that she would have welcomed a hand then.) With Lu directing back at the room, my direction in the banquet room and all of the "helpers" schlepping the items between the two, things were done before I even realized it. Putting out all of the items for the both the Live and Silent Auctions was done so quickly that I even got to take a shower before dinner this year.

Each year I fret for days and weeks as to whether we have enough, too much or items that people will want to bid upon. This year was no exception. The items that we had were more numerous and unique than ever before! I am always amazed at the price that some of the items reach as final bid—this year was no exception. And then there are always those items that I know will bring "top dollar" and then I worry about who I will be bidding against!

Not only was there generosity when it came to donating items this year, but this year again as in past years, the generosity was on the bidders side as well.
