OUR TRIP TO CALLAWAY

Our July meeting was held on Saturday, July 16th at Callaway Gardens. The purpose of conducting our meeting there was two fold - a cooler change of venue and to see the facilities that would be our 2006 Specialty Show site.

A number of faces that are typically missing from our regular meetings were able to attend because it was held on a Saturday afternoon. Peggy & Richard Grapp, Helen Jesse and Jennifer Wehking were in attendance along with some of our 'regulars', Alice Alford, David Fischer and Lu Dunham. Not enough members for quorum, but more than enough for a tour of the facilities and sampling of the delicious food that Callaway has to offer.

The main hotel lobby area at Callaway is not new and modern, but exudes tradition and southern hospitality. The clerks behind the desk are customer service oriented and very helpful. The Lobby Bar and Grill is quite spacious and will probably be the site of many impromptu meetings as well as the likely spot for the National welcome party at the beginning of the week.

Walking through the patio area we went on to the ballroom facilities. The ballroom is housed in a separate building adjacent to the hotel restaurant. It can be set up to be one gigantic ballroom (10,000 square feet) or subdivided into as many as four smaller rooms. The plan is to use three fourths of this area for the show ring and exhibitor viewing area. The hallway in the ballroom facility will be the perfect place for vendors to set up their wares for the week. The room across the hall from the ballroom will be the area for the reserved grooming spaces.

Behind the ballroom facility are the buildings where all of the hotel rooms are located. It is in one of the

ground meeting floor rooms in the building directly behind the ballroom structure that we will be able to have 'day crating'. Next to the hotel and ballroom structures is

PAWS LEGISLATION

The American Cavalier King Charles Spaniel Club's Board of Directors voted unanimously AGAINST supporting the PAWS Legislation!

The evening of July 18, 2005, the Board of Directors of the American Cavalier King Charles Spaniel Club, Inc. voted unanimously and with great passion and conviction **AGAINST** supporting the PRO-POSED PET ANIMAL WELFARE STATUTE (PAWS) 2005 and **WILL** be adding their name to the "parent club list of those who say no" as well as encouraging their specialty clubs and regional clubs to spread the word to as many lists and groups as possible. The Board of Directors is also encouraging dog owners to write their local legislators to not support this legislation. This statement from the American Cavalier King Charles Spaniel Club, Inc. may be cross-posted to any clubs or lists. A formal letter of disapproval will be submitted to AKC shortly. This formal statement stems from the ACKCSC's compassion for those breeders that also are involved in breeds that have large litters and for those who co-own dogs for the protection and mentorship of those who are just beginning in the breed. These responsible hobby breeders can not be penalized in any fashion "for doing things right".


Things are moving along. We're still looking for individuals to sign up to work on some of the committees. The following is a list of committees that definitely need your help:
