Dog Park Safety Tips

Going off leash? Be on guard. Off leash parks are becoming increasingly popular and for good reason: they're a great place to let your dog run around, play and socialize! But keep in mind, dogs will be dogs-which is why owners need to be extra vigilant about common dog park-related injuries.

- Sprains—playful, excitable dogs are prone to accidents at the park-they can trip in a hole while running or play too enthusiastically with a pal, resulting in sprained joints.
- Lacerations—Sometimes even the friendliest wresting match between dogs can turn into a tussle. Cuts & scratches are common dog park injuries, so keep your pooch away from aggressive dogs and look out for foreign objects like fallen branches.
- Toxins—Beware of any chemicals used by the park, like fertilizers, snail bait or pesticides. If you suspect that your dog has been in an area where chemicals treatments have been used, clean his feet and legs thoroughly with soap and water and watch carefully for signs of exposure.
- 4. Invaders Regular flea and tick preventive treatment is critical for every dog. Also, be a good park citizen by picking up after your dog. Internal parasites, viruses and bacteria can be easily transmitted by contact with fecal matter from other dogs.
- Overheating—No matter what time of year, always have plenty of water on hand to quench your dog's thirst and



Home Remedies-Have You Tried Olive Oil?

Does your dog have dry, flaky skin?

I found the most wonderful home remedy for the problem... Olive Oil! We all have known the health benefits of olive oil for years. I started adding one teaspoon of olive oil to each dog's bowl of food one meal per day. What a difference the olive oil has made; I saw a change within 5 days.

My dogs' coats have returned to their thick and shiny state. I can not recommend this remedy enough! All of my dogs love it. They love the taste and consider it a special treat.

I find that my dogs spend a lot of time indoors during the winter months With the gas heat, the dogs were reacting to the dry air inside the house. If you have been having the same problem, give olive oil a try. You will be amazed by how well and how quickly it works.

Remember to ALWAYS run any home remedy by your vet!!

Is Your Dog an Good Citizen?



I want to be a Canine Good Citizen too!!

"...the AKC has a national program..designed to recognize dogs who have good manners at home and in the community.."

Did you know that your favorite friend can become a good citizen? The AKC has a national program called the AKC Canine Good Citizen Program and the program is designed to recognize dogs who have good manners at home and in the community. All dogs who pass the 10 step test will be awarded a CGC test may receive a certificate from the AKC.

You can either teach your dog at home or enroll into a basic learning class or a class taught by a CGC instructor.

Once your dog is ready to be tested, you can find evaluators at local AKC dog shows, , some training classes, at a number of pet super stores, or dog events. All of the exercises are completed on a leash. To find an evaluator near you, visit the AKC.org website and check out the CGC section.

What are the 10 skills needed by all CGC dogs?

Test 1: Accepting a friendly stranger

The dog will allow a friendly stranger to approach it and speak to the handler in a natural, everyday situation.

Test 2: Sitting politely for petting.

The dog will allow a friendly stranger to pet it while it is out

with it's handler.

Test 3: Appearance and grooming.

The dog will welcome being groomed and examined and will permit someone, such as a vet, groomer or friend of the owner, to do so.

Test 4: Out for a walk (walking on a loose lead)

The handler/dog team will take a short "walk" to show that the dog is in control while walking on the leash.

Test 5: Walking through a crowd.

The dog and handler walk around and pass close to several people (at least 3), to demonstrate that the dog can move about politely in pedestrian traffic and is under control in public places.

Test 6: Sit and down on command and staying in place.

The dog will respond to the handler's commands to 1) sit, 2) down and will 3) remain in the place commanded by the handler (or sit down position, whichever handler prefers)

Test 7: Coming when called by the handler.

The dog will come when called by the handler. The handler will

Test 8: Reaction to another dog.

To demonstrate that the dog can behave politely around other dogs, two handlers and their dogs approach each other from a distance of about 20 feet, stop, shake hands and exchange pleasantries and continue on for about 10 feet.

Test 9: Reaction to distraction.

To demonstrate the dog is confident when faced with common distracting situations, the evaluator will select and present two distractions. Examples of distractions include dropping a chair, rolling a crate dolly past the dog, having a jogger run in front of the dog, or dropping a crutch or cane.

Test 10: Supervised separation

This test demonstrates that a dog can be left with a trusted person, if necessary, and will maintain training and good manners. The owner will go out of sight for three minutes.

You will need to bring your dog's brush or comb to the test. Dogs must wear a buckle or slip collar for the test.

Our March Speaker is Reschedule for the April Meeting

Please join us at our April meeting where we are fortunate to have Elizabeth Barrett as our speaker. Elizabeth was rescheduled due as our March meeting was cancelled due to snow!

Elizabeth Barrett began showing dogs in conformation, obedience and later agility, in 1991 with the purchase of a black male Doberman. That dog went on to become the second male in the history of the breed to obtain the AKC's Master Agility Championship. He was also one of four dogs that Elizabeth has handled into the Doberman Pinscher Club of America's (DPCA) Top 20 Agility rankings.

In addition to handling multiple breeds to Top 10 conformation status, she has breeder/handled several

Dobermans to their AKC championship, obedience and agility titles. She handled the 2007 DPCA National Best of Winners in a class entry of over 225 dogs and bitches, and has successfully handled dogs from five of the seven AKC groups. In 2009 she was asked to judge the DPCA's Top 20 Conformation Event.

Elizabeth has regularly been featured as an agility and physical therapy columnist in the *Doberman Digest*, has been reprinted in *Front and Finish*, and is featured as a contributing author in the to Bob and Pat Hastings' *Puppy Puzzle* video-- *Another Piece of the Puzzle: Puppy Development*. She co-authored a three hour presentation on Pain Management with an

Emphasis on the Geriatric Patient for the 2009 conference of the American Holistic Veterinary Medical Association.

Flizaheth Rarrett was

certified in canine massage therapy in 2002 and graduated with honors as a Registered Veterinary Technician. Certified by the University of Tennessee College of Veterinary Medicine and Physical Therapy, she manages Caring Canine Rehabilitation Center in Stone Mountain, Georgia as well as working at their satellite office, Loving Touch Animal Wellness and Fitness Center in Midtown Atlanta.

Atlanta Metro Pet Owners!! Please be aware of this law that is in effect in the City of Atlanta. It is being actively monitored by the Atlanta Police Department (APD) and you will be fined if you are caught in violation of the ordinance! These signs are posted about the City and there even was a TV news segment on this ordinance.

ALL PETS MUST BE KEPT ON LEASH

THIS AREA IS MONITORED BY APD

The City of Atlanta urges you to be a responsible pet owner.

- Walking your pet on a leash and cleaning up after your pet is the law!
- Please urge violators to clean up after their pets as well.
- Fines for allowing a dog to run off-leash or for not cleaning up after them include penalties up to \$1,000, a prison term up to 1 year, community service up to six months, or a combination of the above. Don't let this happen to you.
- City Ordinance 110-70. Pets. No person shall walk any pet in any park except on a leash, unless the area of the park is explicitly designated as an offleash dog area.
