

Natural Remedies: Toxic Foods for Dogs

What is safe and healthy for a dog to eat? Certain food items are actually toxic to dogs and can result in a whole host of symptoms and ultimately to death.



People food is safe for dogs, right? Think again. While feeding dogs table scraps and leftovers may seem like a good way to cut back on food waste, there are several foods that should never be fed to your dog. Because dogs metabolize food differently from humans, they can suffer from severe reactions after consuming foods that may be harmless to us.

What Makes Food Toxic?

Before analyzing the culprits, it's important to come to a better understanding of just what the term 'toxic foods' means. Toxic foods may not cause death. The term toxic refers to foods that are harmful and poisonous, but keep in mind that the dog's reaction will vary with the amount of substance consumed, the size of the dog, the breed of dog, and the amount of time that has elapsed since consumption. These substances do have the potential to kill if eaten in large doses, but small amounts may only result in the animal exhibiting a few more minor symptoms.

It's also important to realize that foods can be toxic for a variety of different reasons. The reaction could be caused by the chemical make-up of the food itself, or the symptoms could be caused by inadequate preparation of the food.

Common Symptoms of Food Toxicity

While the symptoms of food toxicity can be many and varied, there are a few more common symptoms to watch for. Common symptoms may include, but are not limited to, difficulty breathing, dilated pupils, muscle spasms, seizures, lethargy, vomiting, diarrhea, elevated heart rate, and increased urination. Again, it's important to remember that the appearance of the symptoms and their severity will vary greatly depending on many factors, and the sooner the situation is dealt with the better. If there is any doubt, contact your local veterinarian. The ASPCA also has an animal poison control hotline that can be helpful in an emergency.

Known Toxic Foods

This list is by no means exhaustive, but the following is a list of the more common known toxic foods.

- **Alcohol:** Any kind of narcotic can be lethal to dogs. They can 'overdose' just the same as humans can, but with their lower body mass it takes much less alcohol to reach that level.
- **Avocado:** The fruit, seeds, and bark of this plant contain a substance called Persin which can cause a whole host of negative symptoms.
- **Bones:** Tiny fish bones and chicken bones can become health hazards by sticking into and obstructing the digestive tract, or in some cases puncturing the digestive lining.
- **Cat food:** This contains a higher level of both protein and fat, and is not beneficial for dogs in large quantities.
- **Chocolate, Coffee, and Tea:** Any kind of caffeine product in general is not a good idea. A compound found in these products called theobromine stimulates the heart and nervous system, and can be fatal. With chocolate, the darker the variety, the greater the danger. Also keep in mind that the high fat content of chocolate is not good for dogs.
- **Dairy:** Some animals do not have enough lactase in their systems to adequately digest the lactose found in dairy products and may develop diarrhea.
- **Eggs:** The presence of an enzyme called avidin causes a reduction of the absorption of biotin, which can result in shin and coat problems for dogs. Raw eggs may also contain Salmonella and E. coli.
- **Fatty Foods:** Too much fatty food can lead to pancreatitis.
- **Grapes and Raisins:** These contain an unknown toxin that damages the kidneys and can ultimately lead to kidney failure.
- **Liver:** Feeding in large amounts can cause Vitamin A toxicity which will affect the muscles and bones.
- **Macadamia Nuts:** The macadamia tree as well as the fruit contains an unknown toxin that can adversely affect the nervous and digestive systems. Macadamia nuts also contain high levels of phosphorus which can cause bladder stones.
- **Mushrooms:** Some varieties can be toxic to dogs, so it's best to avoid them altogether.
- **Nutmeg:** Too much of this spice can negatively impact a dog's health.

- **Onions:** Onions contain sulfides and disulfides, particularly thiosulfate, which can damage red blood cells. Excessive consumption can lead to severe anemia and death.
 - **Sugary Foods:** When consumed in excess, these can lead to obesity and dental issues.
 - **Xylitol:** This substance stimulates insulin release which can ultimately lead to liver failure.
- Yeast Doughs:** Any kind of raw yeasty dough consumed by a dog will ferment in the stomach, which may lead to alcohol toxicity. In addition to this, the yeast's expansion in the stomach can cause gas, abdominal discomfort, and even ruptured intestines.

How to Prevent Access to Toxic Foods

The first step, of course, is to know just what your pet should avoid. Keeping oneself well-informed may mean the difference between life or death for your dog. Once you're aware of the potentially harmful substances, the next step is to take measures to restrict and ideally completely prevent the animal's access to these substances. Keep dangerous foods away from areas the dog may be able to reach. Keeping your garbage out of reach is also important.

Be aware of food items that may contain these substances. Onion may be present in a certain food you think might be harmless to your pet, or perhaps macadamia nuts are present in an entrée. Make sure the food is completely free from potentially toxic substances before feeding it to your dog.

And finally, make sure you have a plan in case the unthinkable happens. Keep numbers handy to call in case of an emergency, and don't hesitate to call, even if it turns out to be a false alarm.




